Rechargeable Battery Program

In cooperation with the Rechargeable Battery Recycling Corporation

The Rechargeable Battery Recycling Corporation (RBRC) can help you recycle your portable rechargeable batteries. RBRC recycles the following portable rechargeable battery chemistries:

Lithium Ion (Li-ion)
Nickel Cadmium (Ni-Cd)
Nickel Metal Hydride (Ni-MH)
Small Sealed Lead (Pb)
(weighing less than 2 lbs/1 kg)

Locations

You can drop off your rechargeable batteries at Bond Park Community Center, Herb Young Community Center and Middle Creek Community Center. Just look for the Rechargeable Battery drop off box.

Where to find Rechargeable Batteries?

In cordless tools, cellular and cordless phones, camcorders, digital cameras, remote control toys and laptop computers all use rechargeable batteries, but eventually the batteries can no longer hold a charge and they need to be recycled.

Look for the Seal

Look for the RBRC Battery Recycling Seal on the battery packs in your rechargeable products. If it's rechargeable, it is recyclable.



Drop off your used batteries

When you arrive at one of the following sites, Herb Young Community Center, Bond Park Community Center or Middle Creek Community Center, take a bag from the box, place the battery in the bag, seal the bag, and place it in the box.

Batteries Reborn!

The spent rechargeable batteries are then sent to the recycling facility. The recovered materials can be used to make new products - such as new batteries and stainless steel products such as silverware.
