

# The Facts on Cary Community Bonds Vote February 2, 1999

- ✓ The Cary Town Council has voted unanimously to place four community bond issues before Cary voters on February 2.
- ✓ The projects included in the bonds have been developed with strong citizen input.
- ✓ All Cary polling locations will be open from 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.

## Water System Bonds

Cary's water supply is running low. Cary pays a premium to purchase water from Raleigh and Durham to supplement the treatment capabilities of the Cary-Apex Plant, which cannot meet today's needs or future federal regulations. The \$66.5 million water bonds will:

- Upgrade existing water treatment plant's capacity, reliability and efficiency
- Purchase four new elevated water storage tanks
- Meet federal requirements of the Safe Drinking Water Act

## Streets and Sidewalks Bonds

The \$62.6 million Streets and Sidewalks bonds will be used to add badly needed lanes and sidewalks in areas all around town.

- Add 5.5 miles of new sidewalks
- Add lanes to 15 miles of streets
- Improve 28 intersections

## Parks and Receptions Bonds

The \$10 million Parks and Recreation Bonds will be used to continue the Town's commitment to providing a wide variety of parks and recreation opportunities for the next 10 years by helping to fund:

- 17 neighborhood parks
- Six Community Centers
- Five Community Parks
- 20 miles of greenways to preserve natural areas

## Swim Center Bonds

Research shows that swimming is the top recreational activity not currently served by the Town. There is a \$10 million bond on the ballot to build a swimming center.
