F2 Bond Park Community Center

The Bond Park Community Center is a 29,000 square foot facility nestled in the surroundings of Fred G. Bond Metro Park. The center features 2 full size gymnasiums for athletic programs and 3 multi-purpose rooms for meetings and classes. The Bond Park Community Center hosts programs in fitness, dance, drama, self-defense, basketball, volleyball and various other activities as well as being the base for one of the Town of Cary Summer Day Camps. There are locker rooms on site and all the rooms are available for renting. The friendly staff is available to assist you with program registration, room rental, and general information.

F3 Cary Senior Center

This 17,000 square foot Cary Senior Center is a recreation and education facility designed by and for older adults of our community. Resources for Seniors, Inc. also has a staffed office within the Cary Senior Center and provides information and referral services to visitors.

P4 **F1** Fred G. Bond Metro Park

Bond Park, a 310-acre facility, is one of the larger municipal parks in Wake County. The park design preserves the environment, offering opportunities for both passive and active recreation. All facilities are integrated into natural setting surrounded by trees. The park offers a 42-acre lake for fishing and boating, as well as picnic shelters, athletic fields, an amphitheater, trails, a large playground and the ropes course.

Middle Creek Community Center represents a collaborative effort between the Town of Cary and the Wake County Public School System. The Community Center, adjacent to Middle Creek School Park, has a gymnasium and two smaller classrooms. Programs are offered in fitness, dance, arts, and wellness. Middle Creek School/Park features tennis courts, softball fields, basketball slabs, soccer fields.

F8 Amphitheatre at Regency Park

The Amphitheatre at Regency Park is one of the most distinctive performing arts venues in the southeast, accommodating 7,000 patrons among over 20 acres of stately hardwoods and pines adjacent to Symphony Lake. The covered performance pavilion is paired with a spectacularly designed roof build entirely of glass – 388 pieces, including 194 different dimensions and shapes, which provides a curving geometry. The performance season runs from May through October, and is the summer home of the North Carolina Symphony and a variety of performances, including movies, throughout the season. F5 Herbert C. Young Community Center

The Herbert C. Young Community Center features several areas for recreation programs and meeting rooms. The center contains a double gymnasium on the lower level for athletic programs, fitness and activity classes, which can also be converted into space for cultural performances and meetings. The upper level contains two large meeting rooms with adjacent kitchen for catering. Locker rooms and the center office comprise the remaining space.

F7 Page Walker Arts & History Center

The Page-Walker Arts & History Center was built as a hotel in 1868 by Town of Cary Founder Allison Francis Page. In 1979, the Page-Walker Hotel was listed on the National Register for Historic Places. In 1985, a citizen group, the Friends of the Page-Walker Hotel, joined with the Town of Cary to restore the deteriorated building as an arts and history center for the citizens of Cary. Today the center is alive with classes, events, performances, meetings, receptions and exhibitions, including fine arts exhibits featuring local and regional artists' works.

P18 Thomas Brooks Park

Thomas Brooks Park, a 126-acre facility, is located in Western Cary off Green Level Church Road near Green Hope School Road. The Park includes baseball/softball fields, picnic shelters, playground, a walking path and support facilities.

F9 Stevens Nature Center at Hemlock Bluffs Nature Preserve

Hemlock Bluffs Nature Preserve, located in Southern Cary, is a unique site of approximately 150 acres. The site features over two miles of trails, and includes a system of north-facing bluffs along Swift Creek, which support a population of Eastern Hemlock trees and other vegetation unusual to this area. The Nature Preserve is a state nature and historic preserve listed on the State Registry of Natural Heritage Areas. The Stevens Nature Center is a 3,700 square foot facility comprised of an exhibit hall, gift shop, a classroom for program activities, restrooms, and office space. The exhibit hall offers exhibits designed to explain the uniqueness and natural history of the area to the visitor, as well as to educate citizens about the environment.

F6 Jordan Hall Arts Center

Jordan Hall Arts Center grew out of the Cary Arts Center, which was established in 1979. Since 1993, Jordan Hall has provided arts classes and activities for all ages. The center features an art gallery for monthly exhibits that promote and support local artists as well as regularly scheduled open studio time for potters, painters and portrait artists. Jordan Hall has a fully equipped ceramic art studio complete with extruder, slab roller, and potter's wheel. The center is also the monthly meeting place for The Fine Arts League of Cary.

F4 Cary Tennis Center

With 30 courts, including a grandstand and teaching court, it is the state's largest hard surface public facility. Amenities include a doublesided practice wall, locker rooms with showers, meeting room and a pro shop (opening in Spring 2003). Clinics and private lessons are offered for children and adults. Some of the tennis courts are shared with Green Hope High School.
