8.	How did the class go? A brief description	Wonderful program on a beautiful fall day in the neighborhood. Attendees discussed various types of permeable and impermeable surfaces, runoff, pollution, contour and slope, punctuated by bird calls and sightings. Class instructor made a serious case of Nature Deficit Disease, and drew group's attention to the feathered friends. The group also discussed the ecology and extent of the watershed. Hands on demonstrations of the mixing of various pollutants brought home the messages. Stoneybrook being a 'Heritage Neighborhood', the group witnessed two important cases of TOC water runoff infrastructure, now 'grandfathered- in' that actually contributes to erosion and flooding on Hampton Valley and Holly Circle.
9.	Incentives/giveaways if any offered	Audubon brochures on native plants for attracting birds and information of Wake Audubon was offered.
10.	Any green event guidelines followed?	Many! Minimal paper or any other waste to promote the program or during the program. All outdoors in fresh autumn air.
