Cary Paints Plumtree Way Water Tank

About the Project

The Town of Cary is repainting the Plumtree Way Water Tank located near the intersection of Ten-Ten Road and Plumtree Way. The paint on the 16-year-old tank is showing signs that new paint is needed. The new paint will extend the life of the tank by 15 to 20 years, ensuring its continued safe storage of drinking water.

What to Expect

- The work will be performed between 7:00 am and 6:00 pm, Monday through Friday
- There is potential for minimal noise related to tank cleaning and painting activities.
- Cellular antennas located on the side of the tank will be temporarily moved to poles on the water tank site
- No service disruptions or traffic impacts are expected

Tank Facts

- The tank is an elevated water storage tank, standing 141 feet above the ground
- The tank holds 1 million gallons of drinking water and is one of seven tanks in the Town's water distribution system
- The tank was constructed in 2001
